COVID RESTRICTIONS

I'm afraid we are having a few problems – perhaps because people who haven't been coming to church during the pandemic are unfamiliar with the restrictions that we were required to put in place...

- **Please observe the seating restrictions as indicated on the benches, whether family groups or individuals. Our approved limit is 51 – we cannot admit more than that.**

- Everyone is required to wear a face mask except young children and anyone excused on health grounds.

- Please gel your hands coming into church.

- Because of the risk posed by handling items if you take a newsletter **you must take it home with you when you leave**. Do not leave it behind whether in the bench or at the back of church.

- The same applies to the hymn sheets that we are using.

- Exchanging a "sign of peace" is suspended.

- You must receive communion in your hand.

- Please maintain social distancing at all times and this requires that people leave, socially distanced, at the end of Mass and not stand talking in church (which we shouldn't be doing anyway).

- In the hall tables are safely socially distanced and should not be moved or joined together.

The Sunday obligation remains suspended and therefore you can go to Mass any day. I would like to give priority at the Vigil and Sunday Masses to families with children at school during the week and people who are working on weekdays (and there are usually more places available at the Vigil Mass than on a Sunday morning) and so if you could come to Mass on some other day that would greatly help the demand for places on a weekend.
