<u>REFUGEE WEEK 2025: THEME - COMMUNITY AS A SUPERPOWER:</u> <u>SIMPLE ACTS FOR SANCTUARY</u>

1. Speak to a refugee or someone seeking sanctuary. Do not be afraid.

2. Organise a social or awareness raising event at your church/school and invite refugees.

3. Learn more about seeking sanctuary in the UK. Be well informed and able to challenge prejudice and disinformation. (Refugee Council)

4. There are very few legal aid immigration lawyers for people seeking protection. Local

charity, Justice First, is a lifeline. Can you make a monthly pledge to Justice First?

5. Donate food and/or toiletries to the Mary Thompson Fund.

ASYLUM FACTS: There is no such thing as an illegal asylum seeker

• The 1951 Refugee Convention guarantees everyone the right to claim asylum in a safe country if they are experiencing persecution in their own.

• When the government agrees a person meets the definition in the Refugee Convention, that person is recognised as a 'refugee'.

• Developing countries look after most of the world's refugees. Most refugees live in countries neighbouring their own, crossing borders on foot.

• People do not have to seek asylum in the first country they reach.

• There is no safe, legal route for people seeking asylum. It is recognised that people have always had to use irregular routes. There is no British Embassy to issue visas in countries such as Afghanistan, Syria, Yemen, Sudan.

• Afghan, Syrian, Iranian and Sudanese people make up majority of people on boats. These nationalities have high acceptance rates of their asylum claims.

• Asylum seekers want to work but they are not allowed to.
