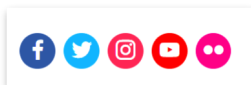

THIS WEDNESDAY: Health and Safety training by the Diocesan Officers for Volunteers:
As valued volunteers in any capacity you are invited to a Health and safety meeting session at St Therese of Lisieux in Ingleby Barwick on 1st July 2026 start time 11:30 with coffee/tea from 11am.

The meeting is to allow you to find out more about Health and Safety in the Diocese, get to know the Diocesan Safety Advisors (Debra Butler North and Coast and Kevin Archer Central and South) and a way for you to let us know if you have any ideas or questions for ensuring your church remains a welcoming and safe place. We will start off with guidance on:

- Fire Awareness including when and how to use an extinguisher.
- Safe use of steps and ladders
- Terrorism preparedness and the current UK threat level.
- COSHH – Control of Substances Hazardous to Health

The rest of the time is up to you, anything you would like to discuss. Some ideas:

- Use of defibrillator: • Manual Handling – how to do a safe lift.
- Electrical – before use checks of portable appliances. • Contractors
- Asbestos Awareness

The only thing we ask is that you keep it relevant to your parish and church business. We hope you can spare the time to come and meet with us and we look forward to meeting with you.

CAFOD'S SUMMER CAMPAIGN 2026 - CANCEL DEBT CHOOSE HOPE (Part 2): This campaign carries on the emphasis from the successful Summer 2025 campaign highlighting the reality that the money currently used for debt repayment could be used for essential services like education, healthcare, and infrastructure, which would benefit millions of people in low income countries around the world if that global debt was cancelled. CAFOD has called on us to build on last year's successful petitioning; over 35,000 signatures, by once again supporting CAFOD's Debt Crisis campaign.

CAMPAIGN GOALS: Pass a UK Debt Justice Law without delay: to ensure UK lenders / banks participate in debt relief and no longer profit from countries struggling with unsustainable debts. Lead urgent Global Reform: use the UK's G20 presidency to unite countries to establish a new debt framework within the United Nations to guarantee fast, fair and effective debt relief for countries in crisis.

GET INVOLVED: Throughout June there will be petition sheets & pens available at the CAFOD stand in the church foyer for parishioners to sign so please take time as you leave church to add your signature and lend support to this vital worthwhile lobby of the UK Government.
